**Workshop 1: JCP Solicitors - Directors duties and liabilities:** Associate Solicitor, Jennifer Rosser at JCP Solicitors will provide an overview of the duties owed by charity trustees of both incorporated and unincorporated associations with particular reference to: trustee eligibility, ensuring your charity carries out its purposes for the public benefit, compliance with your charity's governing document and the law, acting in your charity's best interests, managing your charity's resource, the importance of acting with reasonable skill and care, ensuring your charity is accountable, how to reduce the risk of liability, questions trustees should be asking.

**Workshop 2: Bevan & Buckland - Charities, trading and subsidiaries:** Alison will talk about charities trading activities and the use of subsidiary companies. She will highlight the types of trading which a charity undertakes and the small-scale exemption available. The different types of subsidiary companies will be explained and what support a charity can provide to its trading subsidiary.

**Workshop 3: JCP Solicitors - Business transfers, service provision changes and TUPE:** When a charity is taken over, merges with another or where there is a change in the provider of the service, its employees may be protected under the Transfer of Undertakings (Protection of Employment) Regulations (TUPE). In this session, Sophie Ray will be providing a user-friendly step by step introduction to this complex area of risk for charities, including when TUPE applies, what happens when it does and what charity employers need to do to comply with the law.

**Workshop 4: Wolfberry - Cyber Security:** With the threat of Cyber-attack now magnified by GDPR and the penalties an organisation may face as the result of a breach. It is vital that organisations take steps to ensure they do everything they can to protect the data they hold. Wolfberry's talk will highlight the five most common ways organisations can be breached and fall foul of GDPR. Using a mixture of live hacks and real world examples we will show you the steps you should take to reduce the risk.
